February Dinner Meeting at Fazzini's Taverna to Feature Edward L. Ginsberg, D.D.S. on “Recent Advances in Pediatric Dentistry: Prevention - Pulp Therapy - Trauma Care”

The BCDA February Dinner Meeting will be held on Tuesday, February 26, 2019 at a new venue - Fazzini's Taverna, 9811 York Road in Cockeysville. Our guest lecturer will be Edward L. Ginsberg, D.D.S. speaking on "Recent Advances in Pediatric Dentistry: Prevention - Pulp Therapy - Trauma Care."

About the Lecture: This lecture will include recent evidenced-based guidelines on Silver Diamine Fluoride, Primary Pulp Therapy, and Dental Trauma. These topics will be covered by presenting actual patient cases and treatment. Treatment planning and restorative care for the pediatric patient will also be highlighted.



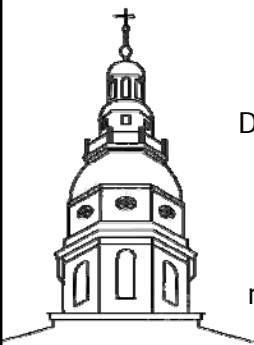
About the Speaker: Dr. Edward Ginsberg was born and raised in Baltimore. He received his undergraduate degree in Biology from Western Maryland College and graduated magna cum laude from the University of Maryland School of Dentistry. He completed his post-graduate specialty training in Pediatric Dentistry at the University of Maryland.

In 1984 Dr. Ginsberg founded the smiles4children dental practice. In 1985, he joined the faculty at the University of Maryland School of Dentistry in the department of pediatric dentistry as a part-time clinical assistant professor. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry, a Fellow of the American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry, American College of Dentists and the International College of Dentists. Dr. Ginsberg has served as President of the Maryland Society of Dentistry for Children and the Maryland Academy of Pediatric Dentistry. He is a member of the Maryland State Board of Dental Examiners sedation committee and is a member of the examination committee of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry. As a member of the Johns Hopkins Hospital Craniofacial Team he evaluates patients with cleft lip and palate and other craniofacial syndromes. Dr. Ginsberg lectures frequently to dental students, residents, dental study clubs, professional and community organizations on various pediatric dental topics.

Dear Members,

We're excited to be trying out a new venue for our February 26, 2019 Dinner Meeting - Fazzini's Taverna, located at 9811 York Road in Cockeysville. Space at Fazzini's is limited, so if you'd like to hear Ed Ginsberg's new presentation, you'll need to register early!

BCDA will be holding its biennial Infection Control and OSHA update course on Tuesday, November 26, 2019. So mark your calendars!

At the beginning of each year, we need to plan for the mandated Infection Control and OSHA required training for workplace safety. MOSH in Baltimore County (410 527-4447) offers a free consultation service for updating mandatory records and documentation. This is the checklist you need to perform for annual training that I received from our consultation. Each employee should print their name, sign their name and date the form and you need to keep it accessible in the training records files in your offices.



1. "Sharps safer systems"- Employees must have ability to comment on problems and suggest changes to current systems and it must be specifically documented.
2. Bloodborne Pathogens standard review- ADA OSHA Compliance Manual has a good template
3. "Right to know" regulation review - Informing employees of hazardous materials or situations within our workplaces is a yearly requirement.
4. Exposure Control Plan is reviewed and modified or updated as needed.
5. Hazard Communication Standard review - evaluate your SDSs.
6. Globally Harmonized System (GHS) and Pictograms should be reviewed.
7. Annual Fire Safety - extinguisher inspection, exit plan reviewed and exit diagram posted.
8. Waste Management Program - review, evaluate and update - is it in writing?
9. Waterline Management Program - evaluate and update program and tracking logs of all kinds.

I hope that the compliance messages continue to be helpful. Call me directly with any questions at 410-258-7275.
